






DEMOS CHIANG Under the Pine Tree, 2023





DEMOS CHIANG

Demos Chiang was born in Taipei, Taiwan. Working across mediums like painting, sculpture and multi-media installation, Chiang's design- and art-oriented practice—a fusion of Eastern and Western cultures—is influenced by his traditional roots and the Western education he received in his formative years.

While anthropomorphic forms in Chiang's works reflect his concern for the current state of the world, his work also reveals his sensitive nature and compassion towards all beings—human and non-human. Layered using rich and diverse textures, with brush strokes evoking a sense of speed and fluidity, his paintings often contain poems in English that are meant as philosophical reflections. In his sculptural forms, Chiang employs the concept of vacuum to examine the notions of transience and time. Among other achievements, Chiang was invited as a main exhibiting artist at the 2021 Chengdu Biennale: Super Fusion, Seoul, South Korea.

Demos Chiang currently lives and works in Taipei, Taiwan.

ARTIST STATEMENT

Across the various formats and diverse mediums he employs, Chiang's artistic practice is an echo of his personal experiences – where the East and the West find themselves in a continuous dialogue with each other. As an artist, he strives to visualise the fragments of his life and process them by recomposing these fragment-like realities through his artworks.

In this set of paintings, Chiang retains blanks, gaps, and imperfections, leaving behind an open composition that invites viewers to amalgamate their own experiences with the works, in order to complete the work.

Moreover, animals often populate and become protagonists of his paintings, personifying values of honesty and simplicity. Chiang finds the eyes of the animals particularly arresting, since they mirror an inner-being that neither intends to hide its desires nor has calculative intentions at heart.

The paintings by Chiang are therefore envisioned to act as reminders for human beings (who share many affinities with animals) to inculcate a sincere view towards life, where the need of a being to curb its desires—often deemed excessive—is reworked.

M. PRAVAT

M. Pravat was born in 1972 in Kolkata, India. He completed his Bachelor's degree in painting in 2002 and his Master's in 2004, both granted by the Faculty of Fine Arts at M.S. University, Baroda. M. Pravat's art practice examines architectural forms and materials through a fractured lens, using paintings and installations. He believes that our lives are unquestionably shaped by the built environments we inhabit. Along with images and materials, architecture plays a pivotal role in the formation of our sensibilities, and in shaping our experiences and understanding of space and form.

His practice is deeply embedded in the manifestations and imaginations of architectural spaces, where he attempts to shed the representational familiarity associated with our built environments, and in doing so, finds himself appropriating, redistributing, and reconfiguring the relationship between images and materials. His ongoing interests in architectural forms emerge from the lived experience of being in a city that is in a constant state of flux where he observes how there is a continuous negotiation between its master plan, its popular aspirations, and the everyday experiences of it, with the flux being both tangible and intangible.

M. Pravat lives and works in New Delhi, India.

ARTIST STATEMENT

From Debris, We Rise is my most recent work building upon themes I have been exploring for over a decade, namely the different expressions of a city under construction. My interest in this subject comes particularly from the discord between the city as it appears in masterplans, in popular desires and in physical experience. I feel we experience the dissonance between the three in our everyday lives with brutal intensity, be it from the intimacy of one's home or on the scale of urban development projects and the creation of smart cities. In the past, I tried to capture these contradictions through under-construction sites arrested in time and textures. In recent years, my practice has turned to exploring processes of deconstruction — not only of the urban environment, but of habitats, materials and even images as such. If, at the heart of any building exercise is also a systematic process of undoing and destruction, how can I measure and express these forces together? Dismantling my house brick by brick is an attempt to find forms and answers to this question with the acute awareness of its impact on homes, infrastructures, cities, and the planet.

POOYA ARYANPOUR

Pooya Aryanpour, born in 1971 in Tehran, Iran, is an artist, art instructor and university lecturer. He studied painting at the Faculty of Art and Architecture, Azad University Tehran, where he obtained his Master's degree in 1999. His work has been extensively exhibited, both in Iran and overseas, at biennials, galleries, art fairs and institutional exhibitions.

Aryanpour started his artistic practice in the mid-1990s, initially focusing on painting. He explored subject material rooted in the traditions of Iranian culture. Some of it included symbolism, schools and styles of narration, storytelling and folklore, Persian calligraphy and its impact on artistic traditions, architecture and painting.

Aryanpour's early pieces employed traces of colour, abstract forms and drawing to create mystery and suspense. By developing his practice through ephemeral forms and lines fused together, he created illusions of familiar shapes and structures; such as plants, animals, artificial creations, architectural configurations and impressions of the human body. These studies led to creating three-dimensional pieces, in which he combined architectural, sculptural and painterly aspects inspired by traditional Iranian ornamentation techniques such as mirror-work (Ayine-Kari).

Aryanpour's sculptures and sculptural installations, while rooted in the very traditions and thought processes involved in his drawings and paintings, appear as large recognisable forms that engage the viewer in an interactive and performative act by transforming his drawings into intricate mirror works and projecting them in space. The artist's teaching practice has led to his exploration of collaborative and community projects, curatorial efforts and large-scale initiatives. Continuous endeavours in the development of the concept of the 'Studio' play a central role in his multidimensional practice. While best known as an artist who has had a significant impact on Iran's contemporary art scene, Aryanpour is also an innovative interior designer, curator and a famed tennis coach and player.

Pooya Aryanpour lives and works in Tehran, Iran.

ARTIST STATEMENT

My creative practice draws inspiration from the rich intellectual foundations of Persian handicraft techniques, and cultural symbolism while referencing and exploring western traditions of abstract art.

In my creative practice, I delve into properties of abstraction such that the blending of colour, line, form, and content constructs a novel suspenseful whole. For me, notional shapes and vivid colours can effortlessly be moulded into infinite forms such as living beings, architectural reliefs, plants, and even perhaps musical notes. I aim at seizing those transient instances in an attempt to solidify the fleetingly perceptible natural forms in the world before they evaporate into the ethereal.

By challenging the philosophical and artistic ideals of finitude and perfection, I make an attempt at deconstructing reality to highlight the inherent gaps in human perception. I believe nothing is ever complete as reality undergoes constant flux and evolution. In that vein, I seek to establish meaningful parallels between the natural, and the conceptual by dismantling the tangible into its fundamental elements whilst simultaneously also reconstructing the same with meticulous care.

RICHA ARYA

Born in 1997 in the village of Panipat, India. Richa completed her Bachelors in Sculpture from Kurukshetra University in 2018 and her Masters in Sculpture from Delhi College of Art in 2020. The move from village to a metropolis made Richa aware of the regressive attitudes with regards to women still prevalent in her hometown, and others like it. Richa's use of an unusual material like iron, which she painstakingly pierces and embroiders might be poetically seen as the struggle to make something out of the hard life that is the norm for the women of the village.

Richa had a solo presentation of her work at Triveni Gallery (2021), New Delhi, supported by the Raza Foundation. Most recently she has participated in several group shows like at The Lexicon Art Gallery (2022), New Delhi, and with Carpe Arte (2022), Mumbai; as well as multiple artist camps and workshops. Richa has been the recipient of the Imaginarium Emami Art Award (2023) and the Prafulla Dahanukar All India Merit Award (2021). In 2022, Richa was a resident artist at Serendipity Arts Festival, New Delhi/Goa, and at Khoj Peers, New Delhi.

ARTIST STATEMENT

Drawing from her experience of growing up in a small village in Haryana, she creates poetic works that call into question the existing socio-cultural norms of her village, and others like it. Richa's use of an unusual material like iron, which she painstakingly pierces and embroiders might be poetically seen as the struggle to make something out of the hard life that is the norm for the women of the village. Through interviews, on-ground research, and lived experience, she creates a tapestry of images, closely associated with the home and the women who inhabit these spaces. Her stitching reveals intricate patterns, representing what she feels should be the level of cohesion and appreciation for everyone who participates in society. Richa's core belief is that 'even the smallest cog in the grand machinery of life contributes as much as its biggest'.

ZHANG JI

Zhang Ji was born in 1978, in Shandong, China. He graduated with a Master's degree in Mural Painting from Central Academy of Fine Arts in 2008, and through his works, he attempts to cultivate an engaging dialogue between painting and religious architecture.

Created using a syringe to patiently apply as much as 120 tubes at 170 millilitres per tube onto the canvas, his works often resemble bas-relief sculptures, with the works modulating between composition and decomposition, and sturdiness and ephemerality. Referencing motifs from religious architecture—specifically mosques, synagogues, and cathedrals in Europe and the Middle East—he creates intricate patterns that are replicated across the canvas. He intends his works to serve as an extended meditation to 21st century viewers of how the visual vocabulary of religion and religious architecture still speaks to the vast and fertile recesses of our collective imagination.

Zhang Ji lives and works in Beijing, China.

ARTIST STATEMENT

As an arts practitioner, I draw inspiration from the historical richness of temple architecture, in an attempt to create a dialogue between the sacred within contemporary sensibilities. My canvases echo these spiritual resonances as they transcend temporal boundaries of our times.

In a calculatedly organised abstraction of painting, I depart from conventional brushstrokes, opting for pigment relief as my medium. By fishing out ornate patterns from religious edifices, I set my own vocabulary of an 'anti-painting' language, shaping a canvas that defies traditional artistic criterions. The absence of a firsthand physical experience in India amplifies the challenge, impulsing a pursuit for information that aligns with my creative vision. Unveiling fragments of distant landscapes like the palace in Jaipur, the Taj Mahal, and the Adinatha Temple, my work transforms these visual explorations into a narrative of abstract expression, inviting viewers to explore the intersection of religious histories and as they are located within our contemporary condition.
